North Carolina Office of Recovery and Resiliency:
Rebuilding Smarter and Stronger

In the aftermath of Hurricane Florence, Governor Roy Cooper created the North Carolina Office of Recovery and Resiliency (NCORR) to ensure our state builds back smarter and stronger. NCORR hired staff experts and expanded capacity to begin quickly moving state and federal disaster funding to those who need it most. The office is also focused on building community resiliency so North Carolina can better withstand future storms.

NCORR has committed more than \$474.7 million of the state's CDBG-DR grants for Hurricanes Matthew and Florence to support homeowner recovery, affordable housing, local infrastructure, small businesses and other long-term recovery initiatives in hurricane-impacted areas.

Homeowner Recovery Program

Rebuilding stronger by helping homeowners repair, replace or elevate their storm damaged homes.



743 home construction projects completed and **177 underway.**



\$277.2 million committed to storm-impacted homeowners.



Strategic Buyout Program

Rebuilding smarter by helping property owners relocate from flood prone areas to safer land.



14 active Disaster Risk Reduction Areas, or buyout zones.



1,451 eligible properties with plans to offer the program to an additional **1,974.**



Grants and Loans

Supporting local and tribal governments as they recover from disaster.

More than **\$52.7 million in grants** and zero-interest loans awarded for disaster-related expenses while local governments await reimbursement from federal programs.



Infrastructure

Providing protection from future storms by strengthening infrastructure.

More than **\$17.3 million** committed to projects designed to prevent flooding and maintain critical community infrastructure.

Projects all **provide future resilience** measures for communities hardest hit by recent federal disasters.



Affordable Housing

Building safer, more resilient communities by providing affordable housing.

More than **\$71.3 million committed** to projects that create affordable rental units for families and seniors in public housing and private multifamily development.



1,068 affordable housing units being built.



Resiliency

Providing expertise and leadership to build statewide resilience.

Provides training, technical support and resources to local communities through the **Resilient Communities Program and RISE Program.**



Develops **resilient strategies** by facilitating meetings of the State Disaster Recovery Task Force.
